Pep Vidal

Pep Vidal (Rubí, 1980) is a multidisciplinary artist with a degree in Mathematics and a PhD in Physics from the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (UAB). His scientific research focuses on the study of infinitesimal changes, exploring subtle interactions and dynamics in complex systems.

His artistic practice is characterized by the intersection of art, science, and technology, grounded in meticulous observation, precise measurement, and exhaustive documentation. Vidal uses scientific methods to delve into natural phenomena, quantum mechanics, land-scape studies, and the duality between observer and observed.

He has received major grants such as the Botín Foundation Grant and the BBVA Leonardo Grant, and has undertaken artistic residencies at the Rijksakademie van beeldende kunsten in Amsterdam and Hangar in Barcelona. He combines his artistic practice with university teaching, as well as occasional curatorial work, such as the centenary exhibition of Antoni Tàpies at the Fundació Antoni Tàpies in 2024.
